Therefore we were thrilled to hear from Wiltshire Library that the following children completed the summer reading challenge: Robert, Elizabeth, William, Noah, Henry, George, Isaac, Jamie, Benjy, Esme, Millicent, Maud, Isabella and James. It's also been wonderful to see and hear all our children chatting about their favourite books, sharing tales and reading for joy. We can see the positive impact of parents reading with their children. Reading together every day with love and enjoyment is a gift to your children, creating language rich environments together with lots of opportunities to talk. Well done to you all and keep up the good work!

How wonderful also to receive a certificate for the part our children have played in designing a stamp for the Royal Mail. Although none of our entries were picked for the stamp in Spring 2021, so many entered across the UK our children are now part of a Guinness record of the 'largest stamp' competition!

Still life observational drawings by **Silbury** class focussed on recording details of shape, proportion and tone, with improving accuracy and concentration skills evident in a super display of art work from all.

Inspired by Ted Hughes 'The Harvest Moon', **Avebury** class produced these beautiful layered silhouette chalk designs, followed by a super poetry performance from the whole class at sharing assembly last week.

In **Stonehenge** Class, we were delighted to welcome Julie Whitehead from Old School Nursery to share story time on Monday and look at our Marvellous Me project as our foundation children continue their learning journey with us. Sarum have been developing their understanding of mixing and blending using different media to create texture and pattern in their Autumn pictures with lots of creativity and ambition.











Supporting the character and moral development of all our pupils, giving them aspiration for themselves and hope for the communities of which they are a part forms the structure of our PSHRE curriculum. We guide and support children to grow in respect and tolerance, and feel worthy in their own lives, enabling them to make good decisions about relationships and have an understanding of the importance of physical activity, good nutrition and good health care to support physical and mental wellbeing.

This week we have thought about Lucy's Blue Day with an inspiring message of hope and compassion in collective worship from Mrs Jones. This tale is about a very special little girl with magical hair. It changes colour with her emotions. If she is feeling happy, it is purple. If she is jealous, it will turn green. This charming story is the tale of when Lucy wakes up and her hair is blue and she doesn't understand why. Lucy soon learns that it is ok not to be ok. Things will occasionally be difficult and challenging for us. This is part of life. Using the 10 Habits for Good Mental Health, mindfulness and reflection we have explored how we can ask for help as well as spending time quietly and putting ourselves in a

Reading Champions and Parent Volunteers -


Thank you to everyone who participated in the Safeguarding and Child Protection Training this week. We work in a regulated activity and our all work is underpinned by an outstanding safeguarding culture which applies to everyone who works in school – staff, governors, PFA, volunteers, contractors, peripatetic teachers, catering team, cleaners and site team. Over 30 parents have volunteered in some

Covid19 We maintain rigorous routines of ventilation, hygiene, handwashing, twice weekly lateral flow tests for staff and supporting children who are isolating at home with a blended



Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia). If the child has a positive test result but do not have symptoms, they should stay at home and self-isolate for 10 days from the date the positive test was taken. This isolation period will be extended if they go on to develop symptoms by counting 10 full days from the day following their symptom onset. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for a PCR test (the normally available test type) and this can be arranged - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) or by calling 119.

Please continue to take care not to block driveways and to park sensibly so that we can keep our whole community safe. 
